Our topic this half term will be history-based, asking the question 'What was life like in the Mayan civilisation?' This will give us an opportunity to look at the success, downfall and legacy of this ancient civilisation. The children will interrogate a range of historical sources and use them to form their own opinions.



<u>English</u>

This half term, we will be focusing on the text 'The Mysteries of Harris Burdick.' This is a wordless picture book with a bit of a mysterious back story!

Our focus will be on writing narrative and developing our use of dialogue in stories to move the story along. We will also be looking at different types of stories and how their features might vary.

Children need to make sure that they are still reading five times a week. There is also still time to read the remainder of the Recommended Reads before the school year ends!

<u>Maths</u>

Our mathematics this half term will develop the children's understanding of graphs and averages, negative numbers and recapping skills in preparation for high school. We also like to use this time for some mathematical problem solving, looking at how maths and strategy is involved in games and number problems.

Maths homework sheets will continue to be provided on a fortnightly basis.

Standon Bowers Residential

Our residential takes place from Wednesday 12th June until Friday 14th June at Standon Bowers Outdoor Education Centre. While the children are away, updates will be shared via ClassDojo including pictures of what the children have been up to each day.
